Biographical Note

Dr Jean-Baptiste Jeangène Vilmer has been Ambassador-designate of the French Republic to the United Republic of Tanzania since 10 August 2026, after serving since 2022 as Ambassador of France to Vanuatu and Solomon Islands, where he led a 25-person team at the heart of Indo-Pacific, climate and regional-security issues. In that capacity, he managed several major crises: Category 5 cyclones, a magnitude-7.3 earthquake that destroyed the embassy, and complex evacuations during unrest in neighbouring New Caledonia. He was awarded the French Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs Medal of Honour for acts of bravery and dedication.

Previously, he held positions at the intersection of diplomacy, defence policy and strategic analysis. From 2016 to 2022, he was Director of the Institute for Strategic Research at the Military School (IRSEM), the French Ministry for the Armed Forces' main research institute, where he led a 50-person team and launched *Le Collimateur* with Alexandre Jubelin, now the leading French-language podcast on defence and international security, as well as LeRubicon.org, a French-language strategic-analysis platform that he still co-directs, developed with Canada's Network for Strategic Analysis and the Centre Thucydide at Paris-Panthéon-Assas University.

From 2013 to 2016, he served as Policy Officer for "Cross-cutting Issues and Security" at the Policy Planning Staff of the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, advising the Minister on international security, global governance, counter-terrorism, international law and emerging threats. He had previously served as Attaché at the French Embassy in Turkmenistan.

He is an Honorary Ancien of the NATO Defense College and a former member of the French Defence Ethics Committee. His leadership has received international recognition: Munich Young Leader at the Munich Security Conference in 2018, High Potential selected by the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 2019, and participant in Singapore Civil Service College's Leaders in Governance Programme in 2019.

Before joining the French civil service, Dr Jeangène Vilmer pursued an international academic career. Trained in philosophy (Bachelor's, Master's, PhD), law (Bachelor's, LL.M., postdoctoral research) and political science (doctorate), he held a Canadian Banting Postdoctoral Fellowship at McGill University's Faculty of Law after serving as Lecturer in International Relations at King's College London and as a postdoctoral researcher at the École normale supérieure in Paris. During his doctoral studies, he also undertook a year of research at Yale University and taught at the Université de Montréal.

Dr Jeangène Vilmer is the author or editor of 27 books and approximately 170 articles and book chapters (2,128 citations; h-index 23, including 17 since 2021; i10-index 66) on international relations, strategic affairs, the ethics of war, international law and the transformation of conflict, with particular attention to hybrid threats, information manipulation and influence operations. His books have received several awards, including the Prix Maréchal Foch of the Académie française, the Olivier Debouzy Prize of the Club des juristes and August Debouzy law firm, and the Paris Universities' Chancellery Prize in Law and Political Science. His most recent book, *Le Réveil stratégique*, received the 2025 Grand Prix of the Group of Francophone Ambassadors in France at the Académie française.
